

SPOTLIGHT ON ANGEL TREE

Christmas gifts for 648 children of incarcerated parents. Thank you to *all* who served in December 2015:

- 193 Saint Barnabas households purchased gifts
- 648 children received gifts
- 33 people coordinated gift requests
- 78 people attended wrapping night
- 8 people made cards with messages for the children
- 8 people moved all the gifts into Hutton Hall
- 27 people inventoried gifts and prepped for delivery
- 4 people printed and organized maps to homes
- 3 different groups of teenagers shopped for gifts
 172 people delivered gifts to homes on December 19
- Dozens of people shared photos on social media
- That's 23 years of Angel Tree ministry and counting!


Lent and the Transformation of the Unconscious
