



Music Makers

Designed for children to have fun while developing a love for music, Music Makers is a music education and choral performance program for preschool and kindergarten children (ages 3-5). Led by Sarah Petersen, Coordinator for Children's Ministries, children in Music Makers have the opportunity to sing together in Children's Chapel. Meets weekly throughout the school year from 5:30-6:15pm on Wednesday evenings in the Children's Center.

Children's Choir

Children's Choir is an opportunity for all children in the parish and the wider community to participate in music education, choral singing, and performance opportunities. Curriculum includes elements of solfege, harmony singing, note reading, and sight singing. Children's Choir is a progressive step in our children's music ministry that comes after Music Makers for preschool and kindergarteners. 


Adult Choir
