





Becoming a Presence of Peace in the World
The Arts of Acceptance, Listening and Compassion

SATURDAY, MARCH 17, 9AM – 4PM

If you long to be someone in whose presence others are better able to find peace amid difficulties, then cultivating the “little” arts of acceptance, listening and compassion takes on great importance.

And perhaps there’s no better teacher of these arts than Dr. James Finley, who embodies peaceful presence and generosity of spirit and intellect. A former monk, whose spiritual director was Thomas Merton, Finley is an author, clinical psychologist and core faculty member of the Center for Action and Contemplation’s Living School. He visited Saint Barnabas in 2015, and we are delighted to welcome him back.

This one-day retreat will include periods of conference, prayer and contemplation, with time for questions and answers, breaks, and lunch (provided). CDs and DVDs will be available for purchase.
