


Our most recent addition is Pam Bell, who will begin her 2-year formation process this summer. Projected ordination, God willing, is June 2019.


## Sing in the Saint Barnabas Summer Choir!

**Congratulations to our 21 new Community of Hope Lay Chaplains commissioned on May 14.** Community of Hope is rooted in the wisdom found in the Rule of Saint Benedict, a guide for common life written by Benedict for monks in the 6th century. The rhythmic, communal, and incarnational character of Benedictine religious practice also helped to shape Anglicanism as found in our Book of Common Prayer. Benedictine Spirituality also offers wisdom to those of us seeking connection to God outside of monastic settings. Through his rule, Saint Benedict teaches that humility, balance, hospitality, and spiritual growth contribute to meaning and purpose of the Christian Life. These values also uphold the pastoral care provided by Community of Hope Chaplains.

We are at a time of transition and energy. We're learning to be even more of the church we are meant to be.
