

### *The Opioid Crisis Affects YOU*

Nearly 17,000 opioid overdoses and record deaths in the previous 18 months in Arizona may have gotten our attention, but we may not realize how close to home this crisis is. Do you or someone you know suffer from chronic pain? Have you ever been prescribed an opioid, such as Hydrocodone? Are you an employer or a health care provider? A concerned citizen?

Learn more about this crisis and how recent policy changes are changing prescribing practices and patient treatment in Arizona. Jennifer Carusetta, a long-time Saint Barnabas parishioner (and daughter of Ann and Tom Hott), is the Executive Director of the Health System Alliance of Arizona. She will be sharing her knowledge and insights into the opioid crisis: how the community can be part of the solution and how to end this plague that ultimately affects all of us.

MARCH 10 | MEALS ON THE STREETS - DOWNTOWN PHOENIX

Join us as we serve the people of Phoenix with good food, compassion, connection, and courage to keep moving forward! Serving Phoenix is a mission led by our youth that all ages are invited to participate in. We meet once a month immediately after the 10:15am/10:21am services and carpool together to downtown Phoenix to serve meals, snacks, and water to men, women, and children living on the streets. It takes us a very short time to distribute the meals, but each person who receives a meal also gets a greeting, real eye contact, and respect for the journey they are on. Ages 4-84 participate in this sharing of food and it is life-changing every time for all involved.


